

29th May 2022 The Ascension of the Lord

Today we celebrate the Ascension, as the start of a special time of waiting. Jesus told his friends to wait in Jerusalem for the great gift they would need for their future work of sharing the Gospel.

Some of them might have wanted to get straight down to work, feeling there was no time to waste. But he told them to take their time, to wait. He was asking them to tune in to God's time, rather than rush ahead. It was God's will they were meant to do, not their own. Having to wait until Pentecost was a necessary step. They could only do God's work when God's special gift was given and received.

The words of Jesus apply to us also, "You shall be my witnesses." We are to be his visible, ambassadors in the world. To do this we need God's prompting Spirit, and for that we need to pray. After lesus left them, they returned to Jerusalem and were "continually in the Temple

praising God." The Acts shows them gathered in an upper room, joining in prayer.

Like the apostles and our Blessed Lady waiting for Pentecost, we are waiting on for the Spirit. Our prayer is more a quiet listening than asking for what we want. This prayer of waiting needs a quiet heart, and silence expresses it better than words.

The Ascension invites us to enter into that prayerful waiting as we prepare for Pentecost next Sunday.
